Curriculum Planning:

- Curriculum always in line with the international curriculum framework.
- Cambridge curriculum resources standards are correlated with the International Cambridge curriculum framework.
- Any missing Cambridge curriculum for the missing standards to be covered with extra lessons by the teacher through the standard lessons.
- Standardized curriculum which prepares students to standardized examinations with DOKs in class and internal exams.
- Linguistic Arabic, Islamic and QH curriculum from the ministry completes all standards and timeline with no missing units.
- Term plans to specify the mapping of the units and weeks to complete all standards within academic year. Any units which cannot be covered to be mentioned in curriculum review and state the reasons.
- Daily lesson plans with SMART objectives, product, process and assessment in classroom. Reflection at the end of each lesson.
- Special lesson plans for SEN students by the SEN department modify the daily plans and term plans from the subject teachers as per the level of SEN students.
